Florida residents and any individual in Florida who is present in Florida for the purpose of providing goods or services for the benefit of residents and visitors of the state is eligible to be vaccinated.

All individuals under the age of 18 receiving a vaccine must be accompanied by a guardian and complete the COVID-19 vaccine screening and consent form. To download a copy of the form, <u>click</u> here.

The Moderna and Janssen (Johnson and Johnson) vaccines are authorized for persons age 18 and up. Persons ages 16-17: The Pfizer vaccine is authorized for persons age 16 and up.

Demographic information on COVID-19 cases due to ongoing epidemiological investigations, are provisional and subject to change: For the week of April 25 through May 1, there were 46 new Walton County cases reported. Walton County total cases (7,748). Municipalities by ZIP code can be found on the dashboard (click on the bottom of the page Cases by ZIP code). Detailed community data excludes outbreaks at Correctional Facilities, Long-Term Care Facilities, and out of state residents tested in Walton County and can be found on the County Line Report on FloridaHealthCOVID19.gov.

There have been 87 deaths in Walton County. COVID-19 Hospitalizations in Walton County Hospitals as of today (5) This data may include persons other than Walton County cases.

Included in total cases is 495 current and past outbreaks in Walton County Correctional facilities staff and inmates.

Included in total cases is current and past outbreaks of (274) residents and/or staff that have tested positive for COVID-19 in Long-Term Care Facilities in Walton County.
